"Some of my fondest memories are of Sunday School at St. Cloud. My Sunday School teachers were Edith Scroll, Lilian Kinsgrob, Edith Dean, Marie Wolf Scroll, and Dorothy Robertson who now lives in Florissant, MO. Dorothy and I still chat about the 'Good Old Days.'

Rev. R. Lloyd Roberts was our minister and he and his wonderful wife, Nan, were Father and Mother to everyone in the congregation. Their daughter, Jean, was in my class and Gwen was in my sister Janet's class. I often

think of meetings and birthday parties in the manse.

Sunday School closed for the summer the last Sunday in June. That Sunday was called "Children's Sunday" and children took part in the service. On Saturday.
